After winning their first game of 2009, the Bearcats hope to continue the winning ways at Central Oklahoma when they take on the Bronchos in Edmond. The Bearcats defeated Kentucky Wesleyan last weekend 50-20 while UCO fell in the final seconds at Texas A&M-Commerce 27-23.

Junior SBU quarterback **Steve Gachette** continues his record-setting career for the Bearcats. Already this season, he's set single game school records for total offense (573 yards) and passing yards (459) as well as career marks for passing attempts (1198) and total offense (8672) which added to the ten individual marks he held coming into the year. He became the only player in SBU history to throw for more than 400 yards and rush for more than 100 in a single game against Harding. He ranks third in the nation in total offense (363 yds/game) and fourth in the nation in passing yards (1518).

WR **Johnnie King**, who led the nation in receptions per game (89 grabs in 10 games) in 2008, is tied for 29th nationally in receiving yards per game (90.6). SBU ranks 9th nationally in Division II in total offense (456 ypg) and ninth in passing offense (306.2 ypg). Sophomore WR **Charles Johnson** has stepped recently, with back-to-back career highs in receptions (eight at Harding and ten at SIU) and has led the team in receptions the last three games.

LB **Jarred Schumpert** is second nationally in tackles per game at 12.6. Schumpert has led or tied for the team lead in tackles in his three previous seasons with SBU. He is also tied for 8th with 2.1 tackles for loss/game

THE COACHES AND THE ALL-TIME SERIES

Bearcat head coach **Keith Allen** is in his third season at the helm of the Bearcats. He's already engineered a significant turnaround, moving the 'Cats from 0-11 his first year as interim coach, to 5-6 in 2008.

Tracy Holland is 8-8 in his second year guiding the Bronchos. He was named LSC North Division Coach of the Year after UCO won the division title after starting 0-4. The teams have met twice before, with UCO winning both times in Bolivar (30-7 in 2003 and 43-40 in 2008).

SCOUTING THE BRONCHOS

The Bronchos have played four of their first five games on the road. UCO's first four games were against nationally-ranked clubs with three of those on the road. **Brandon Noohi** leads the UCO attack, going 125 of 205 for 1185 yards with six TDs and five picks. **Caleb Prince** is tied for seventh nationally with 0.8 interceptions per game, after a three-interception performance at Commerce last week. The UCO defense had five total picks in the game, tying a school record.



GOING DEEP

SHOOTOUT STUFF

In last season's game with the UCO Bronchos, the contest featured 83 total points, 785 total yards and five lead changes. It also included a 95-yard kickoff return, a safety, a fumble recovery in the endzone for a touchdown, and a missed field goal at the end that would have tied the game.

RUSH, RUSH

Against Kentucky Wesleyan, the Bearcats set new season highs for team yards rushing (238) and yards per rush with 7.2. The game also had SBU season highs for points (50) and yards per play (7.7) while **Steve Gachette** tied the season high with 51-yard touchdown run.

MORE SEASON HIGHS

Last year versus Central Oklahoma, **Tyrin Holt** had an SBU 2008 season high for tackles with 15 combined stops. Gachette also had season highs with 34 completions and 62 attempts. UCO's **Da'Marean Pullen** had a 2008 SBU opponent season high with 31 rushes, **Marcus Martinez** had three sacks and **Ryan Gallimore** had a 95-yard kickoff return.

NOT MANY RECORDS LEFT

Junior QB **Steve Gachette** continues rake in the records, with SBU marks for single game total offense and passing vs. Harding, career total offense in the game with NWMSU and career attempts vs. UCM. He entered 2009, already holding SBU records for most touchdown passes (6), passing attempts (68) and passing completions (45) in a game. He also holds SBU records for most passing attempts (515), passing completions (315) and passing yards (3360), touchdown passes (27) in a season. CJ'S COMING ON STRONG

WR **Charles Johnson** has been a major factor in the offense lately. The sophomore from Kansas City, Mo., and heir apparent to top 'Cat wideout **Johnnie King**, has led the team in catches in the last three games (8 catches at HU, 10 catches for 102 yards at SIU and 6 catches for 101 yards vs KWC).

FOURTH DOWN FRENZY

The Bearcats are 7 of 15 in fourth down conversions this season while opponents are 11 of 19. On third down, the numbers are 25 of 78 for SBU and 37 of 90 for their opponents.

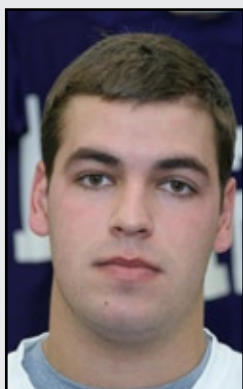
PICK YOUR POISON

LAST GAME FOR THE SBU BEARCATS

Bearcats roll Kentucky Wesleyan for first win

BOLIVAR, Mo. -- The SBU Bearcats jumped on the Kentucky Wesleyan Panthers early and rolled to a 50-20 victory to pick up their first win of the season.

The Bearcats (1-4) scored on a 35-yard run from **Thad Everson** to grab an early 7-0 lead. Later in the first quarter, after a **Brock Jolly** punt was downed at the one yard line, **Kyle Swallows** tackled KWC's **Thomas Gordon** in the endzone for a safety. Following the free kick by the Panthers, **Steve Gachette** raced 51 yards for a touchdown to give the Bearcats a 16-0 at the end of the first period.



Kentucky Wesleyan (0-4) opened the second quarter scoring with a touchdown on a screen pass from **Vincent Lalonde** to **DaMarcus Ganaway** from 31 yards out. SBU would score at the nine minute mark on a 16 yard strike from Gachette to **Derrick Foster** to push the Bearcat lead back to sixteen points. SBU would tack on another touchdown at the 4:42 mark, this time on a 12-yard pass from Gachette to **John Austin**. Brock Jolly would close out the first half scoring with a 37-yard field goal, making the halftime score 33-7.

Just 40 seconds into the third quarter, Gachette would throw his third touchdown pass of the game, this time from 46 yards to **Johnnie King**. The Bearcats would get a "pick six" midway through the third, when **Willie Johnson** intercepted a pass and returned it 60 yards for a score.

KWC would add scores in the fourth quarter on a three-yard run by Lalonde and a TD pass from Lalonde to **Tim Davis**. SBU would also get a second field goal of the day from Jolly, this time from 32 yards away, to cap off the scoring.

"I was proud of our kids. They competed all game," said head coach **Keith Allen**. "We were able to get some young guys in the game in the second half and see what they could do. Steve (Gachette) did a great job making decisions and I was happy that we gave up no sacks. CJ (**Charles Johnson**) has really matured and is stepping up in recent weeks. We still need to work on kickoff coverage, as well as fundamentals defensively. We also had too many stopped drives in the first half due to mistakes, but I was happy to get the win."

Gachette was 18 of 25 for 243 yards and three touchdowns. He also rushed for 61 yards and one score. Johnson was again the leading receiver for the 'Cats with six catches for 101 yards. LAST YEAR VERSUS THE BRONCHOS

SBU's Rally Just Short Against Central Oklahoma

BOLIVAR, Mo. – The SBU Bearcats' furious rally fell short, as they lost to Central Oklahoma, 43-40. SBU was down 10 points with four minutes to play, but was able to score a touchdown, get the ball back, and drive deep into OCU territory. But SBU missed a potential game-tying field goal from 27 yards with five seconds to play.

SBU passed for 328 yards as a team, but lost yards on the ground to a stingy Broncho rushing defense. SBU's **Steve Gachette** was 34-62-1 for 328 yards and 3 touchdowns. **Jonathan Alvarado** caught 10 of Gachette's passes for 114 yards and a touchdown. **Tyrin Holt** made 15 tackles for the Bearcats. Central Oklahoma came into the game with a 1-4 record, but three of their losses were against teams ranked in the top 15 nationally. The Bronchos sacked Gachette eight times for 46 yards lost.

"We were able to move the ball well, but just couldn't convert the key plays in crucial situations," said head coach **Keith Allen**. "We made Steve move around too much, and take too many hits back there. We'll have to get our running game back on track, which we'll address this week. But overall, I'm proud of the way we played for the most part. We'll just have to do a better job of tackling, blocking on offense, and running the football."

The teams jockeyed for field position for most of the first quarter, before Central Oklahoma broke the tie with 2:35 remaining in the first frame, as **Brandon Noohi** ran for a two-yard touchdown. After SBU answered with a **Justin Finch** field goal to begin the second quarter, UCO's **Ryan Gallimore** ran the ensuing kickoff back 95 yards for another Broncho touchdown, pushing UCO's lead back out to 13-3, after missing the extra point. Gachette connected with **Johnnie King** on a beautifully thrown loft for a 35-yard touchdown with 7:13 remaining in the first half. With seconds remaining in the first half, Gachette found Alvarado for a 10-yard strike, giving the Bearcats their first lead of the game, 17-13, as the teams headed to the locker room.

UCO struck quickly to begin the second half, as Gallimore caught a 67-yard touchdown pass from Noohi, as the Bronchos recaptured a lead of 20-17. UCO scored another pair when they trapped Gachette in the SBU end zone. It was SBU's turn, as **Jarod Bankhead** electrified the crowd, when he recovered a fumble (caused from a hit on the opposing quarterback by **Josh Vaughn**) and ran the ball back 55 yards for the SBU touchdown. Finch tacked on a field goal from 28 yards, giving the Bearcats a 26-22 lead.

UCO's **Da'Marean Pullen** scored on a 25-yard touchdown run, giving UCO their third lead of the day, 29-26, with 3:13 left in the third quarter. The Bronchos scored again early in the fourth quarter, on a 29-yard touchdown pass from Noohi to Gallimore, stretching the Broncho lead to 36-26 with 14:11 to play. SBU punted the ball to UCO with seven minutes remaining, which hit an unsuspecting Broncho, and was recovered by **Sean Kelley** in the UCO end zone. Central Oklahoma, however struck right back with a strong drive, capped by a 21-yard touchdown pass from Noohi to **Kendall Hendricks**, giving UCO their 10-point lead back, 43-33.



The Bearcats constructed a six-play, 44-yard drive, ending with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Gachette to **Thaddeus Sanders**, getting the Bearcats to within three. But after a key stop by the SBU defense, SBU missed the potential game-tying field goal with five seconds remaining.
