Bulldogs chipped away SBU's lead all

LAST TIME OUT

Part two of the conference schedule started on Saturday night and SBU showed again why they are considered to be one of the most dangerous teams in all of the MIAA, going on the road to one of the most difficult places to play, Northwest Missouri St.

With the conference tournament right around the corner, SBU looked on the verge to take a monumental step for not just the season, but for the entire program until one play with nine seconds remaining in regulation postponed their fate, falling to NWMSU 96-90 in a dramatic overtime thriller.

For the second consecutive game, Sheldon Pace set a new career high for points scored in a game with 29 off of 8-14 shooting from the field includ-

The Bulldogs tasted victory for the first time in conference play with a 73-62 win over Missouri Southern last Saturday in Kirksville.

Four Bulldogs finished in double-figures with Chip Sodemann leading the way with 17 points. Austin Kirby had 16, Derek Lindsey added 14 and Andy Calmes chipped in 11.

Last Time vs. TSU

- Jan. 25, 2005 @ Bolivar, MO - After spending the entire second half chipping away at a Southwest Baptist 19-point lead, TSU had a chance to tie the game with 12 seconds remaining until TSU forward Grant Agbo threw an errant pass that was intercepted by Martez Young and secured the another Bearcat MIAA victory, 75-69.

SBU found themselves in familiar territory starting the game off with 15-3 run in the first five minutes of action and almost all of this was without the services of leading scorer Deon Davis, who was sidelined only after playing the first minute of play due to an injury.

Southwest Baptist never trailed and was in front by 19 points with just a little over a minute remaining in the first half and led by 14 going into halftime. SBU could not put TSU away in the second half as the

ing six three pointers and a team high seven rebounds. Deon Davis, coming off an injury earlier in the week versus Truman State was just as red hot, shooting 10-15 from the field for 24 points while grabbing down six rebounds.

Northwest Missouri St. did everything they possibly could just to keep up with the SBU in the first shooting over 48 percent from the field and matching their Bearcat counterparts shot for shot from the three-point line, converting six treys.

NWMSU fought their way back into the game in the late minutes and gave themselves a chance to complete the comeback with a three-point attempt from Meyer, but the trey attempt rimmed in and out and SBU grabbed the rebound, but when Chris Schulze saw an opportunity to ice the game by throwing a pass down to the other side of the court to a fellow teammate, Northwest forward Jessie Shaw deflected the pass, stole the ball, and found a wide open Travis Gardner for three to tie the game with nine seconds remaining and eventually force the extra session.

In the overtime period, again both Bearcat squads went back and forth with neither team grabbing a lead of more than three until the last seconds remaining in the game. A three-pointer from Rommel Colina gave Southwest Baptist their last lead at 90-89 with 56 seconds remaining. Northwest Missouri State finished the game with a 7-0 run to earn the season split with SBU.

► EXTREME MAKEOVER

This season has seen a wide range of changes in the program from a new coaching staff, to 10 new players, and even a new place to call home. In the newly renovated Meyer Sports Center, SBU is currently 7-2.

► got threes?

SBU is averaging 12.26 3-Point Field Goals made per game, which leads the MIAA and ranks second in the entire country (NCAA Division II). The Bearcats trail only to the Mighty Oaks of Oakland City University (IN).

When SBU takes 40 or more three pointers, they have posted a 4-1 record in the 2004-05 season. They have shot over 40 three-pointers in five of their 14 games and taken 47 attempts vs. UMR, 44 attempts vs. Ozark Christian, 43 vs. both Harding and Central Bible, and 40 against NWMSU. Earlier this year, they broke both the SBU and MIAA record for three-pointers in a game when they canned 24 three-pointers vs. Central Bible College.

► got more threes?

In the game against Missouri Western on Saturday January 22, the Bearcats broke two single season school records. The first was for most three point field goals attempted. The earlier record was set at 569 for a season, which was set back in the 1999-2000 season. The other record that fell in St. Joseph, MO was for three-point field goals made. The old record was set in the same season back in '99-'00 at 208 in a season. Currently SBU is 219-599 for the season.

► I LOVE L.A.!!!

Sheldon Pace and Deon Davis, the dynamic duo from Los Angeles, California have been quickly making their presence known so far in the MIAA. Both players are either leading or in the top of several major statistical categories including points scored, assists, three-pointers, and steals. Not too shabby for two newcomers for one of the premier conferences in the entire country.

► LESS IS MORE

When the Bearcats defeated Truman State last Tuesday night, two statistics stood out above the rest, except for the final score of course. The first stat was that SBU only committed 8 turnovers, a new season low and the Bearcats only attempted 15 three-pointers, another season low. Sometimes more does not necessarily mean better.

► LOOK FAMILIAR?

In his first season at Bemidji State (MN) back in 2001-2002, his team started off with a 9-9 record and went on to finish 17-11 and was one win away from winning the Northern Sun Conference championship.

► KNOW YOUR ROLE

Senior guard Cedric Ousley has made 44 baskets on the year and 42 of them have been from beyond the arc. Ousley has been one of SBU's most consistent three-point threats on the season shooting over 42% from downtown.

► MAGIC NUMBER...75

Whenever the Bearcats score 75 or more points in a game, SBU is almost perfect at 7-1 with the only blemish on that record came at the hands of Northwest Missouri State in an overtime thriller 96-90, but when Southwest Baptist scores under the 75 mark, the Bearcats are 2-9.

► BEARCATS IN THE MIAA RANKINGS

SBU's Deon Davis is ranked #10 in the conference with a scoring average of 13.5 ppg. SBU also has one other player in the top 20 for scoring, Sheldon Pace is 16th averaging 12.5 points per game.

Pace leads the entire MIAA in assists at 5.21 per game and is second in steals with 2.11 per game and second in assist/turnover ratio (2.06).

Davis is ninth in three-point field goal % (.409). He is also fourth in 3-pt field goals made (2.47) and tied for sixth in steals (1.53).

Chris Schulze currently is in fourth place for rebounding at 6.2 rpg and eighth in blocked shots (0.68).

Cedric Ousley is currently ranked tied for sixth with 2.26 3-point field goals made per game and fourth in 3-point field goal % (.426).

TALK ABOUT A 180° !!!

Only one year removed from a 7-20 season and failing to qualify for the MIAA postseason tournament, Head Coach Jeff Guiot and company have revived a once slumping program into the surprise team of the not just the conference, but the entire south central region!

Already this season, the Bearcats have defeated two 2004 NCAA Tournament participants including Drury (Sweet 16) and Northwest Missouri St. (Elite 8). With the win over Truman St., SBU now has more wins (9) in February than the school did all of last season!!!

BEARCATS VS. THE TOP 25

After being unsuccessful against #10 Emporia State on New Year's Day, SBU won their first game over a nationally ranked opponent for the first time in years when they defeated Pittsburg State 80-72 last Saturday at the Meyer Sports Center. PSU was ranked #18 in the nation at the time by the NABC.

STILL LOOKING FOR A...

Even with all of the early success the Bearcats have had this season, not one player has posted a single double-double. Most recently, Chris Schulze was two points shy (8 pts, 10 reb.) from breaking that statistic vs. Truman State on January 25.

Southwest Baptist is still looking for their first win on the road not only in conference, but in the new 2005 year as well. SBU is currently 1-7 on the road this season.

WHAT A MIRACLE WORKER!

Head Coach Jeff Guiot has drastically improved every program that he has been a coach at. So much improvement that no matter where he goes, he ends up breaking the school's record for most wins in a season. For those who are curious, SBU's record for most wins in a season is 30. In the 1979-80 season, Head Coach Frank Evans led Southwest Baptist to a 30-6 record.

SBU basketball



Looking to turn around the Bearcat basketball program, Jeff Guiot will enter his first year as the new head men's basketball coach. Guiot has spent the last three seasons at NCAA Division II Bemidji State University where he has produced a 54-33 record, the most successful three-year run in school history. This past season, his team won the NSIC (Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference) regular season title with a record of 14-2 on their way to their first 20-win season in the history of the University. The NSIC title was the first for the Beavers since the 1966-67 season.

In his third year, Guiot had his most talented and recognized team at Bemidji State. Senior Charles Hanks was named to the North Central Region First Team and was the NSIC "Player of the Year". Hanks' All-Region award is the first All-Region award to given to a Beaver in the history of the program. BSU also had the NSIC "Newcomer of the Year" in James Roberson. In the NSIC, Hanks, Roberson, and a third Beaver were named to the All-NSIC First-Team.

The past three seasons, Guiot has helped to turn around a struggling BSU program. In his first season at Bemidji (2001-02), he guided the Beavers to a 17-11 record and their first NSIC tournament appearance. The 13 NSIC wins were a school best which put them at a third seed in the NSIC Tournament. The following season (2002-03) he led BSU to 17 wins again and to their first-ever NSIC Tournament semifinal game.

Last year, the Beavers led the nation in three-pointers per game at 11.7 and finished with the sixth-highest total of three-pointers made in NCAA Division II at 338. In that season, 24 records were broken from Bemidji State, the NSIC, and the NSIC Tournament combined.

Prior to taking the job at Bemidji State, Guiot spent one season at NCAA Division I Southern Utah University. In that one season, SUU had their best season ever in the history of the men's basketball program as they won the regular season and tournament championships in the Mid-Continent Conference. Because of their success, SUU was awarded their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament.

From 1993 through 2000, Guiot served as the head coach at Neosho County Community College in Chanute, Kansas. In those seven years, he had three All-Americans and six Academic All-Americans and posted the 2000 NJCAA National Academic Team of the Year. He never had a losing season and won four conference championships while making seven consecutive playoff appearances. With a 164-60 record, he posted the highest winning percentage ever at NCCC. He also had the most consecutive 20-win seasons, most wins at the school, and most post-season wins.

Getting his start at the high school level, he was the head coach at two different high schools. He had a 48-18 record at Inman (KS)



High School and in one season at Schell City (MO) High School he had a 15-8 record. He was also an assistant coach at Chanute (KS) High School where they were 20-4.

Receiving both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Pittsburg State (KS), Guiot was an All-American and all-conference player for the Gorillas. He led the nation in free throw percentage in the 1986 season. At Chanute (KS) High School, he was a Converse All-American, a McDonald's All-American Honorable Mention pick, and the Most Valuable Player in the Kansas Basketball Classic.

Guiot is married to the former Tina Clark who is a 1988 graduate of Southwest Baptist University. They have three children in Crystal (13), Preston (12), and Payton (4).
