SBU VS. TRUMAN

The Game: The Bearcats will travel to Kirksville on Wednesday, Jan. 30 to try to start the second half of conference play the same way they started the first half, with a win over Truman. SBU (8-9, 2-7) enters the game after winning its first game since its 84-83 victory over the Bulldogs on Jan. 2. The Bulldogs have not won since Dec. 10, 2001 when they defeated Culver-Stockton, 79-77.

The series: The Bearcats lead the series 14-12 over the Bulldogs. The last time Truman defeated SBU was in Bolivar on Feb. 12, 2000. The Bulldogs took a 99-76 decision. Truman is 9-5 against the Bearcats at home.

Last time out: The SBU men defeated the second ranked team in the MIAA on Saturday, 79-77. The win over Missouri Western ended a seven-game skid for the Bearcats. The SBU men came out with a furry in the second half after being down 37-30 at halftime and outscored the No. 2 team in the conference in the second period, 49-40, to break the Bearcats seven-game losing streak. SBU defeated the Griffons, 79-77. The Bearcats were led by David Couthie with 19 points, Shelby Tonnies with 12 boards and Ryan Stock with 11 assists.

Truman lost on the road at Missouri Southern on Saturday, 77-62. The Lions led 37-26 at the half. Leading Truman was Scott Coykendall with 20 points while Adam Glosier pulled down a game-high 11 rebounds. Also scoring in double figures for the Bulldogs was Jeff Nepple with 14.

Southwest Baptist: The Bearcats are coming off a much needed victory that ended a seven-game skid. The last victory for the Bearcats was against Truman on Jan. 2 in Bolivar.

SBU's David Couthie was named the MIAA Player of the Week for his efforts last week as the Bearcats went 1-1. Couthie averaged 16.5 points and 3.0 steals per game last week, as he helped SBU snap its losing streak. He scored 19 points in 17 minutes off the bench in Saturday's victory and was 6-of-13 from the field, including 3-of-6 from the arc and 4-4 from the foul line.

The Bearcats shot 50 percent from the field in the win over MWSC, including 57.1 percent in the second half. The Bearcats were 14-of-19 from the charity stripe in the last period, which proved to be the deciding factor.

Head Coach Darin Archer threw Bearcat fans, and its opponents, for a loop when he started J.C. Carter, L.V. Hill, Ed Walker, Sam Willis and Dustin Jenkerson on Saturday. There were no starts between those five before the MWSC game.

All five of the regular starters are averaging in double figures for SBU. Igor Majoros leads the team with 17.8 points per game while Shelby Tonnies is tops on the team with 8.8 rebounds per contest. Also scoring in double figures for the Bearcats are Ryan Stock (12.8), Tonnies (11.4), David

Henderson (11.4) and Coutchie (10.8).

The Bearcats are shooting .454 from the field this season. They are .366 from the three-point arc and .674 from the charity stripe. SBU is out-rebounding its opponents by 8.9 rebounds per contest (40.9-32.0).

Truman: The Bulldogs are currently in the middle of a ten-game losing streak. The last time TSU won a game was on Dec. 10 against Culver-Stockton in Kirksville. The Bulldogs have been on a drought in the MIAA since Feb. 17, 2001 when they defeated Emporia State, 62-58.

Leading Truman is Jiri Mikl with 12.7 points per game while Adam Glosier is tops on the team with 7.9 rebounds per game. Also scoring in double figures is Scott Coykendall (11.8), Mark Huppe (11.4) and Nathan Owen (10.1). Truman is .407 in field goal percentage, .348 from the arc and .572 from the line.

From the Bench...

Quotes from Head Coach Darin Archer



What are your thoughts on Saturday's win over Missouri Western?

It was a good win. We had a lot of people contribute and had a lot of guys step up and make big plays. We finally got over the hump and won a close one against a very good basketball team.

What was the key? I was pleased with the play from everybody. People stepped up and did their jobs. I told them before the game that I needed finishers on the floor, not starters, and they responded well.

What are your thoughts on TSU? We are going to have to play a very solid game. They are better than their record shows and they have been in a lot of close games. They are kind of like we are, if they can get a win, they could get on a roll.

What will be the key to the game? The key is we are going to have to guard their perimeter shooters. They shoot very well from the three-point area. They got really hot last time from the three when we played them, and we are going to have to contain that and keep them out of the game.

What are your thoughts going into the second half of MIAA play? I feel, and our players feel, that our back is against the wall. We are going to have to play with intensity and a sense of urgency. We have the talent and the ability to get to the MIAA tournament, which has been our goal all along, we just have to continue to play well like we did on Saturday.

What is it going to take to make the tournament? We are going to have to continue to improve, especially on defense. Our bench is going to have to continue to step up and we are going to have to continue to stay healthy down the stretch.
