The SBU Bearcats (7-10) look to extend their current winning streak as they hit the road for the Washburn Lady Blues Fall Classic. Facing off against four Lone Star Conference opponents, if SBU can win the opener against Southwest Oklahoma State, they will extend their winning streak to three games, the longest streak for the program since 2002. **Ashley Jurgensmeyer** continues to lead the offense for the Bearcats, ranking fifth in the MIAA in hitting percentage, at .350.



THE COACHES AND THE ALL-TIME SERIES

Bearcat head coach **Kelly Richardson** is in her third season guiding the Bearcats. She's improved SBU's win total from eight her first year to 13 a year ago, and is on pace to raise the bar even higher this season.

Bo Pagliasotti is in his fourth season at SWOSU, where he has been since the program's start in 2005. In about three and a half seasons, Pagliasotti has acquired a 47-104 career record. **Skip Freeman** is in his

third season as coach of Southeastern Oklahoma after taking over as interim coach in 2007. In his first full season last year, the Savage Storm tied the school record for wins in a season at 19.

Chuck Waddington took over as coach at Angelo State just last year, and led them to a 20-14 finish, their first winning record since 2004. Tarleton head coach **Mary Schindler** is in her fifth season at the school, where she has led the TexAnns to two LSC tournament wins, the only two in the last 15 years in the conference.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

Emily Walter and **Jenny Naramore** lead the Southwestern Oklahoma Bulldogs in kills, with 185 and 177, respectively, over 21 matches. **Kayla Bader** is SWOSU's leader in digs, with 3.55 per game. Southeastern Oklahoma is led by sophomore **Brittany McDonald**, who ranks third in the Lone Star with a .330 hitting percentage. **Chelsea Gibson** leads the LSC with 0.49 aces per game. The Rambelles of Angelo State have a duo of attackers, senior **Alaina Sivells** (2.98 kills/game), and freshman **Chelsea Gibson** (3.20 kills/game). Tarleton's **Shay Gracy** heads up the TexAnn attack, averaging 3.05 kills per game, putting her 7th in the LSC.

SBU volleyball falls in five-set heartbreaker to Truman

BOLIVAR, Mo. -- The SBU Bearcat volleyball team hosted the 20th-ranked Truman Bulldogs and fell in a five-set heartbreaker. After dropping the first set, the Bearcats rallied to take the next two sets, before the Bulldogs would win the final two sets of the close contest.

"I was proud of our girls. They fought hard after losing the first set, re-adjusted and came back strong," said head coach **Kelly Richardson**. "But we've got to execute at the end of sets and finish matches."

After Truman (11-5, 2-2 MIAA) won the first set 25-18, the Bulldogs led 14-8 in the second before SBU rallied to tie with an 8-2 run. The 'Cats (5-10, 0-3 MIAA) moved ahead on a kill from **Kelsey Stewart** and would close the second set with a 6-1 run to win 25-20. The teams were knotted at 11 in the third set before SBU would get five points in a run which included three kills from **Ashley Jurgensmeyer**. Truman would later get to within three but the Bearcats would win the third set 25-19.

The fourth set was tightly contested with neither team leading by more than two through the majority of the set. SBU would lead at 22-21 before TSU would take the final three points on consecutive kills by **Lauren Graybeal**. The deciding fifth set was a battle, much like the others. The teams were tied at 11 in the finale but Truman would win at 15-13.

"Our hitters did an excellent job -- we hit our goal for hitting percentage (SBU hit .282 as team). **Bri Wallace** did an excellent job of delivering the ball (a season high 56 assists) and **Marcy Greenwade** had some great digs (25 total). We're anxious to get back in the gym tomorrow to prepare for the two road conference matches this weekend."

Stewart led with 18 kills, followed close behind by Jurgensmeyer (17) and **Alex Smith** (16). Jurgensmeyer led with a .375 attack percentage with Stewart at .372 on the night.

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 25, 2009

Volleyball gains first MIAA win over Missouri Western

ST. JOSEPH, Mo. -- The SBU volleyball gained their first MIAA win of the season with a 3-1 victory at Missouri Western. The Bearcats won the first two sets by identical 25-20 scores, before the Griffons won the third 25-15. SBU would respond by winning the fourth, 25-19, to close the match.

SBU (6-10, 1-3 MIAA) was led by **Alex Smith** (15 kills, .355 attack pct.) and **Ashley Jurgensmeyer** (14 kills, .481 attack). **Brianna Wallace** led with 34 assists while **Marcy Greenwade** led the defense with 14 digs. SBU had a team attack percentage in their set wins with .273 in the first, .235 in second and .281 in the fourth. **Kelli Sicner** had 15 kills to lead the Griffons while **Karin Schmit** recorded 16 digs.

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 26, 2009

Volleyball tops NWMSU for back-to-back MIAA wins

MARYVILLE, Mo. -- The SBU volleyball capped a successful weekend trip north, beating Northwest Missouri State 3-1 on Saturday for back-to-back MIAA road victories. It was SBU's first win over Northwest Missouri since October 25, 2002.

"The girls did a really good job of practicing this week after the loss to Truman," said head coach **Kelly Richardson**. "Getting a win last night at Missouri Western was big and it carried over into tonight. We dropped the first set, but they re-focused and pushed through for three straight set wins. We're proud of our girls for that consistency to get the win."

After dropping the first set 25-18, and trailing 16-9 in the second, the purple Bearcats stormed back with a 7-2 run. After the green Bearcats went up 23-20, SBU won the next five points behind **Marcy Greenwade** serving and strong play at the net from **Kylie Heim** and **Ashley Jurgensmeyer**.

Richardson applauded their efforts. "Ashley did an excellent job at the net and provided an aggressive, attacking strong middle presence. Marcy did good defensively and had some really key digs in the last three sets. Kylie gave us a big game from the right side."

SBU continued to play well in the third and fourth sets, controlling the third 25-14 before taking the fourth 25-17. As a team, the SBU squad hit .412 in the third set and .267 for the match. Jurgensmeyer led the attack with 19 kills and a .567 attack percentage. SBU also got double digit kills from **Kelsey Stewart** (12), **Alex Smith** (11) and Heim (10). Greenwade led with 15 digs and **Brianna Wallace** had 51 assists.

NEXT UP FOR THE SBU BEARCATS

The Bearcats will resume MIAA conference play next week, as they host the ninth-ranked Washburn Lady Blues, followed by the Fort Hays State Tigers. The Lady Blues are coming off a pair of tough five-set losses to nationally ranked Nebraska-Omaha, and Central Missouri. Washburn is currently sitting at 3-2, tied for fifth in the conference, as they take a weekend out of MIAA action to host the Lady Blues Fall Classic. Currently, Washburn allows the lowest hitting percentage in the league, with opponents only hitting .115.

Fort Hays enters this weekend with a 1-5 record in the MIAA, and are coming off an 0-4 stretch in which they faced four straight nationally ranked conference foes. Senior **Lilian Rezende** is third in the league in kills, averaging 3.83 kills per game. **Tracie Hileman** anchors the back line, with 4.26 digs per game, ranking her sixth currently in the MIAA.
