## 4 THE OPPONENT MISSOURI WESTERN (12-4 / 4-3 MIAA)

The Lady Griffons fell to Pittsburg State, 95-71, in Kansas as MWSC fell to 4-3 in the MIAA. MWSC took a two-point lead early, 6-4, before PSU ran off a 22-5 run to clame a 26-11 lead and take control of the game. MWSC could not recover as the Gorillas shot 64% from the floor to finish the game.

Eldra Paixao led MWSC with 24 points as she was 10-20 from the floor and Selma Barbosa put up 20 points. MWSC only shot 18% from three-point range

### Last Time vs. MWSC

It was a controversial call from the referee that cost SBU the game to the Lady Griffons, 52-49. With six seconds left on the clock, Amber Wheeler drove for the winning bucket and converted the layup to be what looked like would be the game winner. It was not that as the referee called a charge on Wheeler, took the points off the board, and gave the ball back to MWSC. The Lady Griffons kept the 50-49 lead and then converted two free throws with three seconds left in the game for the win.

Wheeler had 14 points to pace SBU. SBU was up 24-20 at half-time. They held MWSC to just 36% shooting from the floor. The loss dropped SBU to 5-7 in the MIAA and 13-8 overall.

5) almost accomplished this task. Only down by two at the half, Washburn University (16-1/6-1) made a second half run in the last 11 minutes of the game to take an 81-63 win.

The score does not indicate how close the contest was for the Lady Bearcats. With 12:38 left in the game, SBU 's Jennifer Clymore nailed two free throws to cut WU's lead to one, 48-47. WU then went on a 16-5 run in the next seven minutes for a 15-point lead, 67-52, at the 5:36 mark. That run broke the Lady Bearcats spirits as they could not recover.

Junior Amber Wheeler hit another milestone as a Lady Bearcat as she became the all-time career leader for three-pointers made. She only needed three to break the record and came away with four. She now has 159 three-pointers and surpassed Allison Ramirez (99-01,02-03) who had 157 three-pointers. Wheeler also led all scorers with 21 points. Clymore added 13 points.

## 4 ANOTHER AMBER RECORD

Junior Amber Wheeler put her name by another record in the SBU record books by hitting four three-pointers vs. Washburn. Wheeler now has 159 career three-pointers she has made. She surpassed SBU all-American Allison Ramirez by two, now. She only needed three for the record.

Wheeler now holds five SBU records. She is the career leader for three-pointers made (159) and three-point attempts (426). She holds season records for most points in a game (37 vs. ESU), most three-pointers made in a game (9 vs. UMR), and most three-point attempts in a game (14 vs. UMR). She also has her names in the MIAA record books for scoring the most points in a MIAA Tournament game (37 vs. ESU).

## 4 NOT AS SHY AS A "LYON'S"

Freshman Trisha Lyons received her first start against #2 Washburn. In that start, she came away with seven points and seven rebounds. Her seven rebounds were a career high. Lyons was told by Coach Middleton that she was starting just 10 minutes before the game so she would not be so nervous in her first start against the #2 team in the nation.

## 4 SCORING STREAK ENDED

By only scoring nine points vs. Washburn, Gwyn Smith ended an 18-game streak in which she scored 10 or more points. The last time she scored in double digits was in the 2003-04 season against Pittsburg State (7 points).

## 4 LOOKING AT THE NATIONAL PICTURE

SBU has three players that are competing for national rankings in three different categories. Gwyn Smith is currently 15th in the nation in rebounds (10.5). She is leading the MIAA by almost two rebounds.

Jenny Miller currently is averaging 5.3 assists per game which puts her at 23rd in the nation and third in the MIAA. She had a career-high 11 assists vs. PSU.

Ashley Bland is 26th in the nation for three-point field goal percentage (41.3) and is first in the MIAA in 3-pt % and three-pointers made per game (2.07).

## 4 LEADING THE MIAA

SBU has two players that are leading the MIAA in three categories. Senior Gwyn Smith is #1 in rebounding at 10.5 per game. Ashley Bland is #1 in three-pointers made per game (1.94) and three-point field goal percentage (.397). SBU is also #1 in the MIAA in three-point field goal percentage at .361.

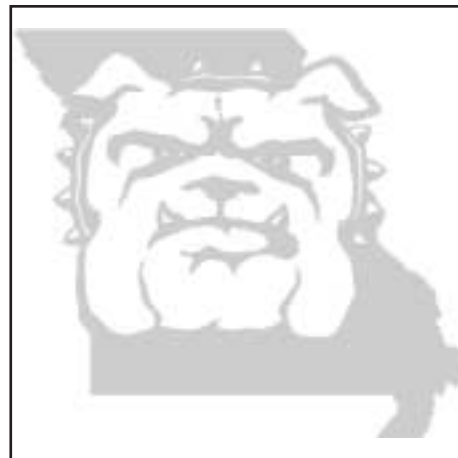

Entering his 11th season at the helm as the head women's basketball coach, Jim Middleton will push his team to make a run at the MIAA Championship. After finishing a 14-14 last season, the Lady Bearcats have something to prove.

Last year, he took SBU to their 10th consecutive MIAA Tournament but they bowed out in the first round. SBU, though, did something last year in the MIAA that had not been done in over 10 years. Sophomore Amber Wheeler was named the MIAA MVP and was the first person since 1992-93 to win the MIAA Freshman of the Year in her first season and then the MIAA MVP the next season. She was also the first SBU women's basketball player to be given the MIAA MVP.

Middleton has the experience to push for the MIAA Championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. He has guided SBU to five NCAA Tournament appearances and advanced to the Sweet 16 in 1999-2000. In 2000-01, the Women's Basketball Coaches Association named Middleton the District VII Coach of the Year as the Lady Bearcats made it to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. At one time, his 1994-95 team was ranked No. 7 in the nation.

With great fan support in Bolivar, SBU has finished well for attendance in NCAA Division II. In 2000-01, they finished No. 8 in the nation (1,569 average per game) and then in the 1995-96 season they were No. 5.

In July of 2001, Middleton added another duty to his title as he was named the new athletics director for SBU. He now dreams of taking the success he has had in his own program and help to make Bearcat athletics one of the best overall programs in the nation.

Middleton, whose record at SBU is 182-101 (.659), holds the most wins of any head women's basketball coach at the school and also has the highest winning percentage.

Although success is important for Middleton, he loves seeing the student-athletes succeed.

It is a privilege to work with the college-age students day in and day out, Middleton said. I love seeing our young men and women succeed and seeing them be the best they can be at whatever it is they are doing. I get great satisfaction of seeing our students graduate. We have graduated every senior that has been on our teams since I have been here. That is success.

In April 1994, Middleton made a trip north of Springfield from Southwest Missouri State to become the new head coach at SBU. In his first season, he laid the groundwork for national success, posting an 18-8 record which tied a school record for most victories in a season. He has since set a new school record for victories, 21, a mark his teams have reached four times.

Middleton served as an assistant coach on the women's basketball staff of his alma mater, Southwest Missouri State University from 1991-1994, prior to coming to SBU. During those three seasons, his duties included coaching the post players, scouting, film exchange and coordinating team travel and the summer camps. Led by Middleton and head coach Cheryl Burnett, SMSU compiled a 78-18 record, won three conference championships, and played in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Final Four in 1992.

He is a 1985 magna cum laude graduate of Southwest Missouri State and received a master's degree in educational administration from Southwest Missouri State in 1987. Middleton was a graduate assistant on the Lady Bears basketball coaching staff under head coach Valerie Goodwin-Colbert from 1985-87, also served as a student assistant for the women's track team and as strength coach for the men's basketball team at Southwest Missouri during the 1988-89 season.

In 1989-91, Middleton worked as head coach of the girl's basketball team at West Plains (Mo.) High School. He compiled a record of 33-18, led the 1990-91 team to a 20-6 record and the South Central Association title, and was named Coach of the Year. Middleton also was girls track coach and taught science and physical education at West Plains.

In high school, Middleton played basketball at Nixa High School and was a three-year starter. He earned all-conference honors his junior and senior seasons. In 1978, his junior season, Nixa went 30-1 and won the Missouri Class 2A state championship. His senior season, the Eagles took third at the state tournament. He graduated from Nixa in 1979.

Middleton has experienced success at every stop in life and is relishing the experiences he is having at SBU. He has been married to his wife, Ronda, for 17 years. The couple has two sons, James, 12, and Jared, 8.
