THE OPPONENT

MISSOURI WESTERN (14-6 / 6-5 MIAA)

The Lady Griffons knocked off #5 Emporia State in St. Joseph, 75-66. MWSC shot 47% from three-point range and 45% from the floor. ESU had a 10-point lead, 37-27, at halftime before MWSC outscored the Lady Hornets 48-29 in the second half for the win.

ESU's loss dropped them from a tie in first place with CMSU's loss to NWMSU.

Five Lady Griffons were in double figures with Brandi Rogers scoring 21 points and Selma Barbosa with 15.

Last Time vs. MWSC

Shooting as cold as it was outside the MWSC Fieldhouse, the Southwest Baptist Lady Bearcats (8-9/2-6) could not overcome a 16-point halftime deficit to Missouri Western (13-4/5-3) as the Lady Griffons claimed the win, 78-65. SBU only shot 7% from three-point range and 27% from the floor in the first half.

SBU's Gwyn Smith picked her ninth double-double of the year with 17 points and 16 rebounds. Amber Smith added 15 points and Jennifer Clymore had 11. Selma Barbosa, the MIAA points leader, recorded 26 points for Missouri Western.

Swapping leads four different times in the first eight minutes of the game, SBU stayed right with the Lady Griffons. Gwyn Smith started the SBU with a 2-0 lead after MWSC missed their first shot. MWSC answered with a 6-0 run for a four-point lead.

In the next minute and a half, SBU put up six straight points to retake the lead, 8-6, on a Wheeler three-pointer. Two more ties came about in just over a minute and Casey Beavers gave SBU their last lead of the half, 13-11, at the 12:05 mark.

SBU's defense was strong in the first eight minutes and then MWSC broke through to score seven straight points for an 18-13 lead. SBU cut it to four, twice, but once again the Lady Griffon offense started to click again with a 10-0 and a commanding 14-point advantage. In that three minute run, SBU could not hit a shot as Ashley Bland broke MWSC run with a two-point basket at the 5:51 mark.

The Lady Griffons then kept their distance and took a 16-point lead into the half. MWSC's Jill Johnson hit two free throws with 44 seconds left for the 16-point lead, 40-24. SBU shot a dismal 7.7% in the first half from beyond the arc as they only made one of 13 shots.

▶ LAST TIME OUT

Scoring just two-points in the first half, Amber Wheeler unleashed for 21 points in the second half as she led Southwest Baptist University to a 67-64 win over Truman State. SBU shot 55% (5-9) from three-point range in the second half. The win also snapped SBU's five game losing streak and put them 1/2 game ahead of TSU in the MIAA standings.

Wheeler did not make any shots from the floor in the first half as her points came from two made free throws. She then made 7-of-13 shots from the floor and went 3-of-5 from beyond the arc to finish with 23 points. Jennifer Clymore added 15 and Gwyn Smith 11.

Coming into the game, Smith only needed six rebounds to surpass Sheri Grady as the all-time rebounder at SBU. She then grabbed six rebounds to move into first place with 818 career rebounds. She is currently averaging 10.3 rebounds per game and is leading the MIAA for the third straight year.

Truman State took their only lead in the first half on a three-pointer from the beginning of the game. SBU cut the lead to one, 3-2, on two Casey Beavers free throws at the 17:45 mark. Thos free throws sparked a 9-0 run as the Lady Bearcats cruised out to a six-point lead, 9-3, in the first 6:27 of the game. TSU's Annie Westhoff put the Bulldogs within in two, 17-15 at the 7:22 mark, but that is as close as they would get in the first half. SBU would take a five-point advantage into the locker, 27-22.

A 10-3 run by the Bulldogs to start the second half gave them their second lead of the game, 32-30, when Natalie Schupbach hit two free throws. In the next 6:11, SBU shot back with an 18-6 run to take a commanding 10-point lead, 48-38, with 10:33 left to play. Wheeler sparked the run and gave SBU the lead back at the 16:44 mark as she hit the first of three three-pointers in the second half. Trailing by one 60-59, with 2:45 to go in the game, Wheeler made two straight free throws that put SBU in front for good. TSU cut the lead to one, again, with 1:32 to go but Smith's 818th rebound turned into a three-point play when she was fouled and SBU took a four-point lead, 66-62, with 1:13 left when she converted the three-point play.

TSU came within two on a Westhoff shot with 38 seconds but Jenny Miller hit one of two free throws to extend the lead to three 67-64 with just 00:18 left in the game.

▶ REBOUNDING QUEEN

Senior Gwyn Smith surpassed Sheri Grady on the all-time career rebounding list when she grabbed six rebounds vs. Truman State. ▶ BACK ON TRACK

After not hitting a three-pointer for four games straight in 12 attempts, senior Ashley Bland found her stroke as she made her only attempt vs. TSU. She has now hit 32 three-pointers on the year and has 84 career three-pointers. At the 10:33 mark in the second half, she nailed the shot to give SBU a 10-point lead. She is now 7th on the all-time career list for three-pointers made.

▶ IN THE HUNT

With the win over TSU, SBU moved back into eighth place in the MIAA and are one-game ahead due to the fact that TSU has only played 10 MIAA games. The win also snapped the five-game losing streak, the longest in Coach Middleton's coaching career at SBU. TSU will host UMR on Monday in the makeup game. SBU is currently 1 1/2 games ahead of UMR.

▶ ANOTHER AMBER RECORD

Junior Amber Wheeler put her name by another record in the SBU record books by hitting four three-pointers vs. Washburn. Wheeler now has 159 career three-pointers she has made. She surpassed SBU all-American Allison Ramirez by two, now. She only needed three for the record. She is the career leader for three-pointers made (159) and three-point attempts (426). She holds season records for most points in a game (37 vs. ESU), most three-pointers made in a game (9 vs. UMR), and most three-point attempts in a game (14 vs. UMR). She also has her names in the MIAA record books for scoring the most points in a MIAA Tournament game (37 vs. ESU).

▶ LOOKING AT THE NATIONAL PICTURE

Gwyn Smith is the only Lady Bearcat that is still in the national rankings. She is currently 18th in the nation in rebounds (10.3) and is leading the MIAA by 1.3 rpg.

Entering his 11th season at the helm as the head women's basketball coach, Jim Middleton will push his team to make a run at the MIAA Championship. After finishing a 14-14 last season, the Lady Bearcats have something to prove.

Last year, he took SBU to their 10th consecutive MIAA Tournament but they bowed out in the first round. SBU, though, did something last year in the MIAA that had not been done in over 10 years. Sophomore Amber Wheeler was named the MIAA MVP and was the first person since 1992-93 to win the MIAA "Freshman of the Year" in her first season and then the MIAA MVP the next season. She was also the first SBU women's basketball player to be given the MIAA MVP.

Middleton has the experience to push for the MIAA Championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. He has guided SBU to five NCAA Tournament appearances and advanced to the Sweet 16 in 1999-2000. In 2000-01, the Women's Basketball Coaches Association named Middleton the District VII Coach of the Year as the Lady Bearcats made it to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. At one time, his 1994-95 team was ranked No. 7 in the nation.

With great fan support in Bolivar, SBU has finished well for attendance in NCAA Division II. In 2000-01, they finished No. 8 in the nation (1,569 average per game) and then in the 1995-96 season they were No. 5.

In July of 2001, Middleton added another duty to his title as he was named the new athletics director for SBU. He now dreams of taking the success he has had in his own program and help to make Bearcat athletics one of the best overall programs in the nation.

Middleton, whose record at SBU is 182-101 (.659), holds the most wins of any head women's basketball coach at the school and also has the highest winning percentage.

Although success is important for Middleton, he loves seeing the student-athletes succeed.

"It is a privilege to work with the college-age students day in and day out," Middleton said. "I love seeing our young men and women succeed and seeing them be the best they can be at whatever it is they are doing. I get great satisfaction of seeing our students graduate. We have graduated every senior that has been on our teams since I have been here. That is success."

In April 1994, Middleton made a trip north of Springfield from Southwest Missouri State to become the new head coach at SBU. In his first season, he laid the groundwork for national success, posting an 18-8 record which tied a school record for most victories in a season. He has since set a new school record for victories, 21, a mark his teams have reached four times.

Middleton served as an assistant coach on the women's basketball staff of his alma mater, Southwest Missouri State University from 1991-1994, prior to coming to SBU. During those three seasons, his duties included coaching the post players, scouting, film exchange and coordinating team travel and the summer camps. Led by Middleton and head coach Cheryl Burnett, SMSU compiled a 78-18 record, won three conference championships, and played in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Final Four in 1992.

He is a 1985 magna cum laude graduate of Southwest Missouri State and received a master's degree in educational administration from Southwest Missouri State in 1987. Middleton was a graduate assistant on the Lady Bears' basketball coaching staff under head coach Valerie Goodwin-Colbert from 1985-87, also served as a student assistant for the women's track team and as strength coach for the men's basketball team at Southwest Missouri during the 1988-89 season.

In 1989-91, Middleton worked as head coach of the girl's basketball team at West Plains (Mo.) High School. He compiled a record of 33-18, led the 1990-91 team to a 20-6 record and the South Central Association title, and was named Coach of the Year. Middleton also was girls track coach and taught science and physical education at West Plains.

In high school, Middleton played basketball at Nixa High School and was a three-year starter. He earned all-conference honors his junior and senior seasons. In 1978, his junior season, Nixa went 30-1 and won the Missouri Class 2A state championship. His senior season, the Eagles took third at the state tournament. He graduated from Nixa in 1979.

Middleton has experienced success at every stop in life and is relishing the experiences he is having at SBU. He has been married to his wife, Ronda, for 17 years. The couple has two sons, James, 12, and Jared, 8.
