

Admission Test required for all applicants to the ASN Program (Step #6 in admission process)

Please note: If first attempt on Admissions Test results in unsatisfactory scores, remediation will be required. Test can only be repeated one time per application period. Student will be required to wait for 60 days before retaking exam. This test fee is non-refundable.

Test Name: Admission Test

Test Dates: 2nd and 3rd Tuesday of each month

Test Times: 9:00 am and 1:00 pm both days

Registration: Must register for the test one week prior to test date. You may register at the College or by calling 417-820-2069.

Admission Test

In order to increase your chance for success, the Student Affairs Committee recommends that you review your math and reading comprehension skills. Review books are available from the receptionist in the month prior to your test. These review book are available on a “first come, first serve” basis and must be returned within a month, usually on the test day.

Cost of test: NON-REFUNDABLE!!!

Test: \$40; *If you test only, and do not need the study guide, the cost is \$32.00.* You cannot check out the review book without paying for the test in full. If a book is not returned within one month or is damaged, you will be required to pay an additional \$40.00 to replace the review book.

All testing, which is computerized, must be done prior to application deadline dates. (see application checklist for dates)

Admission test content:

Personality Profiles and Learning Styles: These tests are for your information, we feel this will help you to identify your weaknesses and strengths in these areas.

Anatomy/Physiology and Chemistry-25 questions each subject. This information will be used in the selection process to determine your science strengths. (Score 70% required)

Math- 50 items covering addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, decimals, percents, converting percents to decimals to fractions, household measurements, military time, Roman Numerals, and algebra. Focus is on math needed for calculations of drugs and solutions. A calculator may be used. (Score of 80% required)

Reading Comprehension- 38 items covering scenarios that require reading at levels needed to comprehend health-related materials. (Score of 80% required)

Student Guide for the Evolve/Reach Fundamentals Exam

The Evolve Reach Mobility, Pharmacology and Fundamentals tests have been implemented to test the readiness of advanced placement students to “bridge” the first and second semesters of the St. John’s College of Nursing of Southwest Baptist University. A score of 700 or better will allow you to be considered for Admission into NUR 2002 or NUR 1104.

The tests will be offered the 4th Friday of each month. They will be given simultaneously. Registration with Ms. Pohl must be done at least 1 week prior to the testing date. You will also need to obtain a permission slip from Mrs. Vaughn prior to registering. The tests may only be taken twice. If you fail one part and pass the other, you will only be required to retake the unsuccessful part.

Review the topics and get back with me for the permission slip. (Because you can only take each test twice, I need to make sure your review is adequate.) Good luck.

Retake cost will be \$26 for each test.
