POLICY: The individual identified to serve as an Instructor in the ATEP must meet or exceed the following minimal job qualifications.

PROCEDURE:

- 1.0 Education & Credentials:
 - 1.1 Hold an earned master’s degree in a relative discipline or field from a regionally accredited university or college.
 - 1.2 Possess current AT certification through the BOC.
 - 1.3 Possess AT licensure in the State of Missouri.
 - 1.4 Personal and professional commitment to the mission of the University.

- 2.0 Work Experience:
 - 2.1 Demonstrate past clinical experience as an athletic trainer for at least 3 years.
 - 2.2 Demonstrate past academic experience at the collegiate level is preferred.
 - 2.3 Possess appropriate experience in both developing and maintaining accredited allied health education programs.
 - 2.4 Demonstrated evidence of recent and ongoing scholarly productivity in a related discipline or field of study is preferred.

- 3.0 Duties:
 - 3.1 Help ensure appropriate accreditation standards are met.
 - 3.2 Teach an appropriate identified undergraduate work load.
 - 3.3 Advise and mentor pre-athletic training and athletic training majors at SBU.
 - 3.4 Serve on appropriate committees at the department, college, and University level as identified.
 - 3.5 Produce scholarly products that both advance the knowledge base for the profession and promote the University.
 - 3.6 Recruit students and market the ATEP accordingly.
 - 3.7 Ensure that the mission of the University is incorporated throughout the ATEP.
