NOTE: In addition to an understanding and appreciation of the foreign culture and civilization, the prospective teacher will demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the degree-granting institution, proficiency in the areas of listening comprehension, speaking, reading and writing.

When Spanish is selected as the second area of certification, the Field Experience I (observing/assisting) should be in the Spanish classroom. Additionally, the student teaching experience may include time in the Spanish classroom.

‡The Special Topics and Intensive Studies courses are taught on a 5-year rotation period and cover a variety of literature genre and periods. They are usually offered for 2-3 hours credit. The Panama Field Course (SPA 4954) is taught every January upon sufficient demand for 4 hours credit.
