Life Service Award Guidelines

Inspired by the Life Beautiful Award presented each year to one male and one female graduate, president John Dowdy suggested to the Southwest Baptist College Board of Trustees in 1955 that the Life Service Award be given annually to graduates whose lives have exemplified the principles which are upheld at Southwest Baptist. Currently, the SBU National Alumni Association Board of Directors nominates a maximum of six names of prospective candidates annually. The recipients are ratified at the spring meeting of the SBU Alumni Board. The award, presented by the president of the University during Honors Chapel at Homecoming, is the highest recognition that the University can bestow upon an alumnus or alumna.

The following qualifications should govern the choosing of Life Service Award Recipients:

- 1) The individual must be a Christian.
- 2) The individual must live an exemplary Christian life.
- 3) The individual must be or must have been outstanding in his or her field of service.
- 4) The individual must have been in good standing while a student at SBU.
- 5) The individual must be making or must have made a significant contribution to mankind.
